




## Island Volcano



Natural phenomena such as volcanoes and various forms of thermal activity are a distinctive feature of New Zealand, and White Island, linked to the chain of volcanoes which runs through the centre of the North Island, has been widely credited as being the safety valve which protects us from major disasters such as the Taupo and Tarawera eruptions.

Though scientists may disagree on this, New Zealand's only marine volcano has the added fascination which all islands seem to have, and since the coming of the Maori to the present day has served as an irresistible magnet to the bold, some of whom have paid with their lives. Fishermen, muttonbird hunters, sulphur miners, scientists and convervationists alike have heeded its call, possibly to be joined in the future by the tourist.

In this book we are given a comprehensive picture of the geological formation of the island, its flora and fauna – both

remarkable in their ability to survive in extremely adverse conditions -, the history of the island both as a mining centre for sulphur, and later as a private scenic reserve, the expeditions to study gannets, the short-tailed bat and muttonbirds. Many myths and legends about Whakaari are explained or disposed of, and the book is based upon the most careful and fully documented research.
